TE REO MĀORI RANGIRIRI PĀ

Rangiriri Pā was an ignition point for the invasion of the Waikato in 1863. The land was later confiscated as part of the 1.2 million acres and lost by Waikato Māori. In 2016, Rangiriri was returned to Waikato and redeveloped as a tribally significant site. Brad Totorewa has been involved in the return and redevelopment of Rangiriri, including the most recent site developments and business venture.
